FACILITY GROUND INSPECTION CHECKLIST

Prior to any baseball game or related activity taking place, all playing grounds that are likely to be utilised are to be visually inspected by a minimum of two persons over the age of eighteen. This checklist is to be used as a guide when doing the inspection walk-through, and then submitted with the **Official Results Sheets** to the South Australian Baseball League Office. Please note: One form is required to be completed for EACH day there are games played at the venue.

NOTE: VENUE OWNERS (eg Councils), MUST BE NOTIFIED IN WRITING OF NECESSARY REPAIRS.

If any areas are found to pose a hazard, then they must be rectified, removed or isolated. Games/trainings/activities are not to proceed until area passes safety inspection. **Check for secure bases, potholes, trip hazards, syringes, broken glass, protruding wire or sharp objects, loose/damaged seating, damaged/exposed sprinklers, slip hazards, shading for dugouts and bullpens etc.**
